Soon afterwards, Jesus went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd went along with him. *Reader:* We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Jesus Christ is Lord:

**All Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free.  
You are the Saviour of the world.**

*Reader:* Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen on earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

*Reader:* As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

**All: Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;**

**thy kingdom come;  
thy will be done;  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us.

For thine is the kingdom,  
the power and the glory,  
for ever and ever. Amen**

*Reader:* We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

**All:     **Though we are many,  
we are one body,  
because we all share in one bread.****

*Reader:* Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink this in remembrance that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

**COMMUNION:**

*If you receive communion in your own church (including if you have been admitted to communion as a child) you are welcome to do so here. Those who do not wish to receive communion or who do not normally receive it are invited to come for a blessing. Please carry this booklet with you to indicate to the priest that you are asking for a blessing.*

***Please sit or kneel for the POST COMMUNION PRAYER AND BLESSING***

**All       **Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.****

*Reader*    May God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the source of all goodness and growth, pour his blessings upon all things created, and

upon you his children, that you may use his gifts to his glory and the welfare of all peoples:

And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you, and remain with you always. **Amen.**
